bearing date the fourth day of August in the year of our Lord one-thousand six-hundred fifty & nine ... may more fully appear, now ... the said Thomas Thatcher by the order of Mr. [blank] Harvey Barbadoes [blank] to the estate of the said Ann Waltham deceased for & in consideration of ten pounds ... paid by Benjamin Gillam Junior the assignee of the before named Benjamin Gillam shipwright, the receipt whereof the said Thomas Thatcher do acknowledge by these presents & therewith in the behalf of the said Mr. Harvy to be fully satisfied & contented," confirmed to "the said Benjamin Gillam Junior" the sale of the lands above mentioned [SLR 6:199-200].

BIRTH: Probably no later than 1595, and perhaps earlier (see *COMMENTS* below).

DEATH: Weymouth 29 January 1658[?].

MARRIAGE: By an unknown date Anne _____.

CHILDREN:

- i WILLIAM WALTHAM, b. by 1649 (see *COMMENTS* below); bur. Weymouth 3 November 1640 (as "W[illia]m son of W[illia]m [sic] Walton" [NEHGR 8:349]). On 23 December 1640, "John Pride hath mortgaged ... unto Will[ia]m Waltham of Waymouth the house wherein he the said John dwells, with one acre & ½ of ground in Salem" [SLR 1:52; ELR 1:1].

- iii HENRY WALTHAM.

ASSOCIATIONS: Jonathan Waltham appeared in three records in the late 1640s and early 1650s, twice in association with the subject of this sketch: 6 December 1645, witness to a deed for land on the Piscataqua [SLR 1:67]; 1 July 1646, with Henry Waltham, deposed in a civil suit at Salem, involving business dealings on the Piscataqua [EQC 1:98]; and 24 February 1652[?], witness to the will of John Cooper, who resided with Henry Waltham [SPR 1:96].

COMMENTS: On 3 September 1635, "Mr. Waltham" was one of six men granted "power to consult, advise, & take order for the setting forwards & after managing of a fishing trade, & upon their account, all charges of diet or otherwise, at the times of their meeting, to be allowed out of the fishing stock" [MBCR 1:158].
