We the subscribers being appointed by the Honorable the Court of Probates
held at Norwich in the District of Norwich in New-England County the 2^d of
April 1751 to sell out to Mr. Rachel Parke widow & Heir to Mr.
Joshua Parke Late of Dutton Township the one third part of the Lands & one half
of the Buildings of the said Deceased according to the Last will & Testament of the
said Deceased I performe thereof we have divided & set out to the said Widow
one third part of a farm of Containing chiefly in Dutton partly in Groton
and partly in Huntington Containing in the whole about one Hundred &
Twenty Acres with a dwelling House above a Corn Crib House two Cows
Cows & encasing thereon thereon to us to be the farm which the said Deceased
had possessed of with the one half of the Building thereon which thirds of
Sons of Land & the one half of said Buildings are bounded & described as follow
Namely beginning the Bounds of said Deceased at the place where the pasture fence
adjoins to the pond thence off about fourteen Degrees South thirty three Rods to
the fence now stands to abate & thence thence South about fifteen Degrees west
crossing the plain fifty four Rods to an apple Tree Marked N. at the Stake thence
South adjoining to the Land of Mr. Robert Parke thence Rods to the swamp
thence South adjoining to the Land of said Robert untill it comes to the southwest
Corner of the Church's Dwelling thence Northwesterly adjoining to a small lonely eight
Rods to the Northwest Corner of said Duttons thence west & by North by side
with fifteen Rods to a walnut tree Marked N. thence westerly station Rods to an
apple tree Marked T.F. thence Northwesterly side Rods and so to a corner
of the porch of the dwelling House thence Northwesterly to the middle of the Chimney
